

PRIVACY POLICY

The privacy and security of your personal information is extremely important to us. This privacy policy explains how and why we use your personal data, to make sure you stay informed and can be confident about giving us your information.

We'll keep this policy updated to show you all the things we do with your personal data. This policy applies to all Members or anybody who uses any of our services, visit our website, email, call or write to us.

We'll will only share it with organisations (eg. The EIBC) or other members (eg. Your teammates or a member of an opposing team asking for your phone number to get in touch with you), when it's necessary (eg Entering National Competitions, cancelling games, etc)

If you have any questions in relation to this privacy policy or how we use your personal data then contact the office.

What personal data do we collect?

Your personal data (any information which identifies you, or which can be identified as relating to you personally) will be collected and used by us. We'll only collect the personal data that we need.

We collect personal data in connection with specific activities such as registration or membership requests, volunteering, etc.

You can give us your personal data by completing an application form or on the social media function on our website, or by corresponding with us (by phone, email or letter).

This personal data you give us may include name, title, address, date of birth, age, gender, email address, telephone numbers, medical conditions, photographs, CCTV images, attitudes, opinions.

If you're a volunteer (eg a coach) then we may collect extra information about you (e.g. references, criminal records checks, details of emergency contacts, etc.). This information will be retained for legal or contractual reasons, to protect us (including in the event of an insurance or legal claim) and for safeguarding purposes.

How we use your personal data

We'll only use your personal data on relevant lawful grounds as permitted by the EU General Data Protection Regulation (from 25 May 2018)/UK Data Protection Act and Privacy of Electronic Communication Regulation.

Personal data provided to us will be used for the purpose(s) outlined in a transparent manner at the time of collection, in accordance with any preferences you express. If asked by the police, or any other regulatory or government authority, we may need to provide your personal data.

Below are the main uses of your data which depend on the nature of our relationship with you and how you interact with our various services, websites and activities.

Administration

We use the personal data you provide as a member to service your membership.

Research

We carry out research with our members to get feedback on their experience with us. We use this feedback to improve the experiences that we offer and ensure we know what is relevant and interesting to you.

Marketing communications

We'd like to use your details to keep in touch about things that may matter to you.

If you choose to hear from us we may send you information based on what is most relevant to you. It will be mainly for administration purposes or to advise you of activities in the Club or to ask for your help.

How can I change my contact preferences?

You should inform the Office (preferably in writing) so we can update your records

We'll always act upon your choice of how you want to receive communications (for example, by email, post or phone). However, there are some communications that we need to send. These are essential to ensure the smooth running of the Club.

Updating your data and marketing preferences

We want you to remain in control of your personal data. If, at any time, you want to update or amend your personal data or marketing preferences please the Office.

What if you want us to stop using your personal information?

You have the right to object to our use of your personal information, or to ask us to delete, remove, or stop using your personal information if there is no need for us to keep it. This is known as the 'right to object' and 'right to erasure', or the 'right to be forgotten'.

There may be legal or other official reasons why we need to keep or use your data. But please tell us if you think that we should not be using it.

Changes to this privacy policy

We'll amend this privacy policy from time to time to ensure it remains up to date and reflects how and why we use your personal data and new legal requirements.
